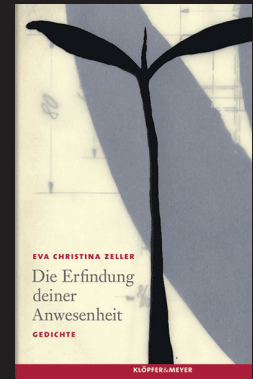
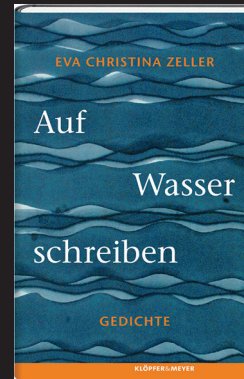

German poet Eva Christina Zeller teaches creative writing at the Leibniz Kolleg at the University of Tübingen. Her writing has been recognized by the prestigious Thaddäus-Troll-Award, as well as the Baden-Württemberg Prize for the Support of Writers in 2014, among many other awards. She has published several books of poetry and has been translated into Portuguese. Several of her plays, including recently "Tod in Tübingen" (*Death in Tubingen*), co-written with her colleague Joachim Zelter, and "An die Arbeit!" (*To Work!*) have been performed. She has been a writer-in-residence in many countries, including New Zealand, Switzerland, Sweden, Italy, Ireland and Denmark.
